On Saturday, April 7, the Young Women's Committee is hosting the YW/Young at Heart retreat at Camp Luther. Linda Rinne is coming to spend the day with us and share the message of how gratefulness enriches our lives. Linda has served in missions both in the USA and abroad. When Will it End?

"For I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory that is to be revealed to us." (Romans 8:18, ESV)

Being a Missionary Using Lifestyle Evangelism

A few years ago when I served on the Evangelism Board at my church, Faith Lutheran in Spooner, Wis., it was decided that we would challenge all our members to be a part of telling others about Jesus. The members were told, "You are all on the Evangelism Board!" We then gave them Lifestyle Evangelism "tools" during the year to help them be on the Evangelism Board and live a life of telling others about Jesus in a painless way. In the same way we could all be challenged to be a missionary using the same "tools." Because, yes, we are all missionaries! Here are some of the "tools" that you, too, can use:

Tool #1 – Using religious bank checks. Whenever you pay a bill, that check is seen by numerous people. What a message of faith you are sending with each check you write!

Tool #2 – Saying prayers out loud before we eat, especially when eating out in public. This is a way to remind ourselves and others that we

are blessed by God. A prayer can also be said at the end of the meal, such as, "O give thanks unto the Lord, for He is good, for His mercy endures forever. Amen." God is good to us; let us proudly and loudly acknowledge that truth.

Tool #3 – Plant flowers as a symbol of new life, new birth. As the flowers grow, they will be a constant reminder of God's great love for all His creation and Jesus' great sacrifice and victory that gives us new life, new birth and enables us to live with Him forever.

Tool #4 – Give flowers to someone with encouraging words to help them begin or grow in her (or his) faith journey. Our faith life is a lot like that of a flower. At some time in our life a little faith seed with the help of the Holy Spirit takes root in our heart and slowly grows as it is nurtured by our reading, hearing and studying God's Word until it develops into a full-fledged bloom that envelops our whole life. Help that faith seed grow in someone else!

Tool #5 – Go fishing! Remember Jesus' words to his disciples in Mark 1:17: "Follow me, and I will make you become fishers of men." As His disciples (missionaries) we, too, are expected to bring others into God's kingdom by sharing the Good News of Jesus' saving grace and eternal salvation. Whenever you see a fish hook, be reminded to "hook one for Jesus." **Tool #6** – Simple words used in a life-changing way. Our words are one of the tools God has given us to spread the Good News of salvation through Jesus Christ. Use those words to bless others by saying/writing "God bless" or "Blessings" or "God loves you" or some other comment when you end a phone call, finish a transaction, sign off an email or send a card or letter. Make someone's day special! Tool #7 - Wear Christian jewelry. What a simple yet beautiful way to demonstrate our faith. Wearing Christian jewelry sends a message to everyone you meet that your faith

in Jesus is important to you. It may even give you a chance to share that faith with someone.

Go ahead, use these "tools" to help you share your faith and be a missionary using Lifestyle Evangelism. Remember, you may be the only Bible someone may ever read!

WHAT IS A LEADER?

What is a leader? Does one need special training or a specific talent? NO! We all are leaders in some way – whether as a parent, a teacher, an officer in an organization or on a committee, a mentor, and so forth.

You may ask, how do I learn what to do, what is necessary to be a good leader. Well there are many resources available. The LWML website (www.lwml.org) has a section for leader resources. Some of the ones I've recently come across are:

- Time Management Manage yourself, not your time! None of us can add more time to a day, but we can learn to prioritize. Do the most critical/urgent tasks first. Sometimes, the tasks on the bottom of your list don't need to be done or others can do them. Learn to delegate.
- Christian Leader Bible Study (Revised in 2015). The study has three parts:
 1) Qualifications of Christian Leaders: being a positive person is very important. It lays the foundation for success. And where does our positive means come from? "I can do all things through Him who strengthens me." Phil 4:13; 2) Priorities and Motives of

Christian Leaders: Ask yourself, "What am I doing?" and "Why am I doing it?" These are two questions that can't be separated; and 3) Characteristics of Christian Leaders: they walk with Jesus, are grounded in the Bible, exercise their faith, communicate with God, and much more. We encourage you to use this Bible study to become equipped as a Christian Leader.

Volunteers in Christ's Ministry. This resource goes into why people volunteer and how we should encourage and support our volunteers, including showing recognition of the work volunteers do.

All these resources are free and ready to download from the LWML website. There are many more besides the three listed above. We should remember God is there to help us and we need only do our best. We are not expected to be perfect leaders; but with God's help and guidance, we can do all things to His glory.


