"This grant money is really appreciated to help keep the doors of Victory open. The people we serve are a needy bunch both physically and spiritually. Our Sunday worship service has been moved to 1PM after a noon meal. Pastor Mark Warner from Good Shepherd in Munising now comes to fill our pulpit as Deacon Weber has retired due to health reasons.

We continue to have the food pantry on Monday but it is open to any in need whenever there is someone at the church. The other day I was weeding in the flower bed at church and someone came who had no food. So I opened the church and supplied his need.

We had a summer Bible study with 12 pre-teens this summer. We thought that interest would wane over the summer, but they were faithful, wanting to continue to learn more about God's word. This past summer we sent ten kids to UP Bible Camp for two week-long sessions. One in June and one in August.

Each summer towards the end of July we have our annual pig roast. It is open to the entire community whether they come to worship at Victory or not. There is food and games in a relaxed and welcoming environment. It gives

and other forms of assistance. We had a grandmother come in with four grandchildren that she had taken away from her drugaddicted daughter in another part of the state. She needed help to get her utilities started and to get a personal protection order against her daughter. We spent the day helping her and showing her where to go as she could not read well. She signed all the paperwork with an X.

We are so blessed with all that we can do because of the generous ladies of the LWML."





be choosing a YWR or more to represent your zone. This is a great way for young women who are not familiar with LWML to see and experience what LWML is




all about. Save the dates and plan now to attend. More information will be available in the Winter Mission Tidings.

Let Your Gospel Light Shine!

'm sure you all remember the song, "This Little Gospel Light of Mine," probably taught to you during Sunday school or vacation Bible school. Jesus told us, as recorded in Matthew 5:14-16 (ESV): "You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden. Nor do people light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a stand, and it gives light to all in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven."

That's right, our good works should give glory to God. When I recently did just that, those attending really perked up when we sang "This Little Gospel Light of Mine." Sometimes just loving




