CHRISTIAN LIFE SUE PFEIL WINTER, WI

If you have spent time in a hospital you may have heard the word STAT! It's a medical term from Latin that means instantly or immediately and is used as a directive for medical personnel in emergency situations.

Another word I know you probably have used is 'ASAP' and its meaning is to do something as soon as possible.

But there is another

acronym for ASAP that I like even better, **Always Say a Prayer**. There are many references to prayer in the Bible, "Be careful for nothing; but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God" **Philippians 4:6**; or even more simply said, "Pray without ceasing" **1 Thessalonians 5:17**.

For me, prayer is a two-way conversation with me talking to God and God talking to me through His Word. I know He always hears me, but sometimes I don't hear or listen to Him because I don't set aside a time for devotions or Bible study. Often, I end up praying in the middle of the night when I can't sleep. I think the Lord wakes me up on purpose just to pray!

Luther once wrote to a friend that it is a good practice to begin and end the day in prayer. He went on to write that we are not to be deceived to wait awhile and pray later because we have things to do. You know what happens, we forget to get back to the praying. We cannot afford to be too busy to pray. A prayerless Christian is a powerless Christian. Jesus spent many hours in prayer. Sometimes He spent the night on a mountaintop in solitary communion with God the Father. If He felt that He had to pray, how much more do we need to pray!

There are many ways to pray. You can do it in your own words (that is hard for some) and then there is the prayer He gave us, The Lord's Prayer. Or you can do as Luther suggests, kneel down or stand with folded hands and with your eyes heavenward say the following, "Dear God, heavenly Father, I am a poor, unworthy sinner, not entitled to raise my eyes or hands in prayer to you, but I come because you have commanded us all to pray. Because you also taught us when and how to pray through your dear Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, you will hear us."

Here is another reminder to

Always Say A Prayer:

There's work to do, deadlines to meet; You've got no time to spare, but as you hurry and scurry, A.S.A.P. – Always Say A Prayer.

In the midst of family chaos, "Quality time" is rare.

Do your best; let God do the rest,

A.S.A.P. – Always Say A Prayer.

It may seem like your worries
Are more than you can bear.
Slow down and take a breather,
A.S.A.P. - Always Say A Prayer.


















Mission Goal Met and Surpassed!

The Lord has richly blessed us, we can be thrilled that the Mission Goal for the 2018-2020 biennium has been fully funded. **Praise the Lord!**

At the last board meeting the members looked at our mite offerings, realized that we could fully fund our last project and voted to fund the Derricks Family project at \$8,000.

Here's an update on the projects paid over the last few months:

#7 "Wonderfully Made" - Resources for People of All Abilities- Bethesda. Kylee Krause Staebell writes: "I have a baby bag program that celebrates babies born with Down Syndrome. Sometimes these bags are the first congratulatory gift that families receive after a diagnosis. The "Wonderfully Made" brochures have been such a blessing to include in these bags. It is such a comfort to people to know that Jesus loves them and their child. It encourages them to seek support from God and a church family. The brochure affirms their child is wonderfully and purposely made in the eyes of God. This is a much needed message to hear for all of these families! What a wonderful way to share the gospel."

#3 District Professional Church Workers
Financial Aid- the second half paid. Many of
our NWD students seeking full-time church work
find themselves with considerable loans. They
are grateful for our help. Please keep these
students in your prayers as they continue their
studies.

#9 Derricks Family Missionary support in Cameroon, Africa, with Lutheran Bible

Translators- There are 20,000 people living in Cameroon that do not know Jesus because they have not heard or read about His loving works. The Derricks are using the money for a vehicle to travel among the many villages to involve the local community in the process of translation. If the local villagers are part of the

Program. He was born on the Menominee Reservation and is enrolled in the Oneida Nation of Wisconsin. He served as the Executive Director of Southeastern

Oneida Tribal Services. He is nationally recognized as a leading educator, lecturer and curriculum specialist in American Indian history and culture. Denning served on the board of directors at Milwaukee's Indian Community School, as an advisor on the Gates Millennium Educational Foundation and was a board member of Indian Summer Festival. He is a lecturer at the University of Wisconsin--Milwaukee in the School of Education

and serves as a consultant and trainer with Boeing Corporation.

Denning is the 2019 inductee to the Wisconsin Pow Wow Hall of Fame through the University of Wisconsin-Oshkosh. He is a men's traditional dancer, pow wow emcee, gifted public speaker and knowledge keeper of Native American traditional ways. He will educate and entertain us as he explains the art of Native American dance. Many have heard of pow wows, but don't understand the various dance styles or protocols. He will explain traditional dance regalia piece by piece and describe the meaning behind the designs. He will encourage conversations with the audience as an integral part of the program. At the end, you will not only know more about Native dance, but also have an opportunity to demonstrate what you have learned! This is a fun, fast-moving program that is perfect for all ages!

Mission Grant Proposals for 2020-2022

1. Introducing Muslims to the Savior - Lutheran Heritage Foundation - \$7,500

Will provide books to church leaders and missionaries that will introduce Muslims to the Savior in their own language.

- Furniture, Fixtures and Equipment for Future Generations – Camp Luther- \$20,000 Provide furniture and equipment for new Community Center Building.
- 3. Support for Concordia Seminary, St Louis' International Graduate School Students \$10.000

Will provide scholarship money for international Graduate School students to equip them to return to their foreign congregations and spread God's Word

4. North WI District Church Professional Church Workers Student Grants - \$25,000

Funds will provide financial aid for NWD students attending synodical colleges and planning to enter full-time church work.

5. Let the Little Children Come to Me, Peace Lutheran Church, Antigo – \$20,000

Funds will provide a building expansion project that would provide early childhood education rooms for infants through kindergarten as well as before and after school care. This project will allow more children to come to Jesus and receive His gifts of grace.

6. Wisconsin Valley Lutheran High School – Tuition Assistance – \$5,000

Funds will help students who find affording tuition an obstacle. Will help more students receive a Christian education.

- 7. Sharing the Joy of Jesus in Prague, Brno and Czech Republic through Mobile App \$12,000 The money will provide a free card, with a QR code, that will be distributed by congregation members to young people who can scan it on their
 - members to young people who can scan it on their phone. This app has Scripture passages, ways to receive a Bible and information about local Lutheran churches. This grant will fund the app for a year and has the potential to reach thousands of unbelievers with the saving grace of the gospel.
- 8. Missionaries Elliot and Serena Derricks with Lutheran Bible Translators \$5,000

 Funds will help with the cost of translation materials such as computers and printers and office space to aid in translating the Bible into the Fali language.
- 9. Victory's Mission of Hope Gwinn Michigan \$20,000

Funds will be dispersed in 2 allotments (one in

each year of the biennium). The monies will be used to aid in the cost of maintaining this ministry.

10. Mission of International Church of Zion-French Congolese Refugees in the Fox Cities - \$15,000

Funds will aid in the purchase of Bibles, worship equipment and Sunday School materials. Funds are also needed to repair and maintain a van to bring people to worship to hear the word of God.

11. Apple of His Eye Mission Society - Training leaders in Israel - \$10.000

The funds will be used to recruit and train Israeli citizens who confess Y'shua as Messiah to join in partnership with Apple of His Eye for mission work in Israel.

12. MOST Ministries – Eyeglass and Evangelism Ministry - \$10,000

Funds used to continue supplying eyeglass and evangelism teams with used or recycled eyeglasses to be distributed on the mission field.

13. Northwoods New Life Resource Center - \$9,000

This non-profit organization needs funds for educational resources, medical and lab supplies. A Christian ministry to women and men struggling with parenting and relationship issues.

- **14. Rosa J. Young Museum \$15,000**Funds used for relocation, management and direction of Rosa J. Young Museum.
- 15. Life Recovery Bibles Marathon County Jail Ministry \$3,000

Funds will provide Bibles to inmates housed in Marathon County jail in Wausau.

16. Voice of Care - Equipping NWD for Disability Ministry and Respite Care - \$9,292

Funds will provide the NWD with workshops about Disability Awareness and Education and prepare volunteers for short-term respite companions.

17. Lutheran Deaf Outreach - \$10,000

Funds Lutheran Deaf Outreach in Janesville, WI to aid in outreach training, resources, and workshops so many deaf people will have the opportunity to hear Gods Word.

18. Parking Lot Expansion St Paul Lutheran Church, Pine River, Merrill - \$5,000 Would help with parking lot expansion as many vehicles have to park on the street.


