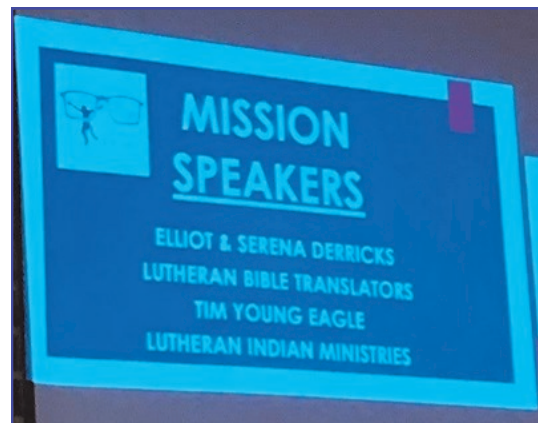

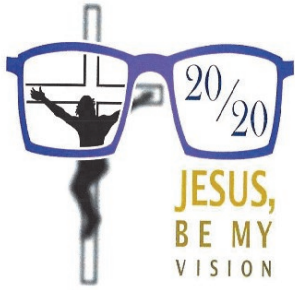
The **2020–2022** biennium mission goal adopted is **\$110,000**. This amount will help fund the 11 mission grants selected. These grants are listed on page 2.

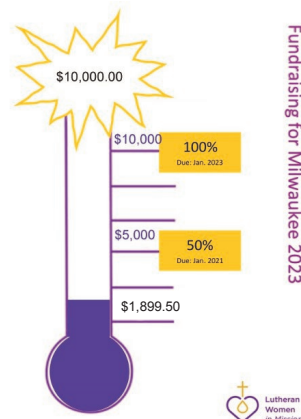

Weathering the Storm

**Facing a storm takes courage.
Being in a storm takes strength.
Recovering from a storm takes resolve.
Looking back on a storm takes faith.**

It seems we have all recently faced a storm and been in a storm and are in need of courage and strength. Where does that courage and strength come from? As Christ's modern disciples we look to God's Word for this courage and strength. Matthew 8:23-27 (NIV) tells us what the disciples of Jesus did while He was with them here on earth:

"Then He got into the boat and his disciples followed Him. Suddenly a furious storm came up on the lake, so that the waves swept over the boat. But Jesus was sleeping. The disciples went and woke Him, saying, 'Lord, save us! We're going to drown!' He replied, 'You of little faith, why are you so afraid?' Then He got up and rebuked the winds and the waves, and it was completely calm. The men were amazed and asked, 'What kind of man is this? Even the winds and the waves obey Him!'"

They knew who to call on when they were in trouble. We, too, can follow their example to know who to call upon. If even the winds and waves obey our Lord, surely, He has control over anything that comes our way. He gives us the courage and strength to face our storms and even is in our storms with us. Look at Deuteronomy 31:6 (NIV):

"Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid or terrified because of them, for the LORD your God goes with you; He will never leave you nor forsake you."

It tells us specifically to be strong and courageous. Why? God goes with us and will never leave us or forsake us.

Now we need some resolve to recover from the recent storm that came into our lives and faith to look back on the storm and see what God wants us to learn from this experience. Often when we've faced a storm, we are troubled because we don't know what is in our future. We forget that God knows. He has our future in His capable hands. Psalm 139:13-16 tells us:

"For you created my inmost being; you knit me together in my mother's womb. I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made; your works are wonderful. I know that full well. My frame was not hidden from you when I was made in the secret place, when I was woven together in the depths of the earth. Your eyes saw my unformed body; all the days ordained for me were written in your book before one of them came to be."

God has all our days planned out for us, they are written in His book even before we were born. Yes, God knows what is in our future. He has our future in His capable hands!

Looking back on the storm and having the faith to believe that this has happened for our good is probably the hardest part of weathering a storm. But God did not leave us alone in this world. John 1:26-27 (NKJV) assures us that we have a Helper:

"But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in My name, He will teach you all things,

and bring to your remembrance all things that I said to you. Peace I leave with you, My peace I give to you; not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid.

“Trust in the LORD with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge Him, and He will make straight your paths.”

That's the best advice for today and tomorrow.

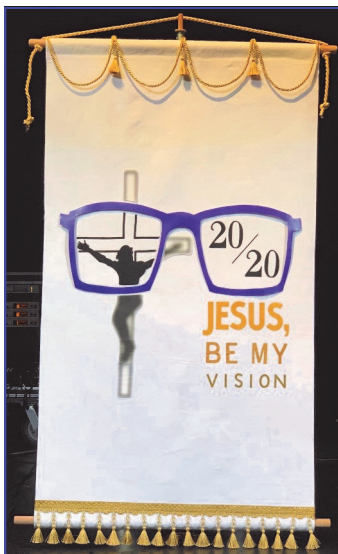

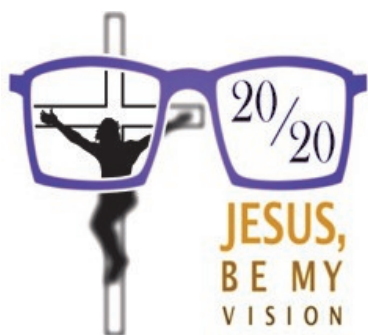

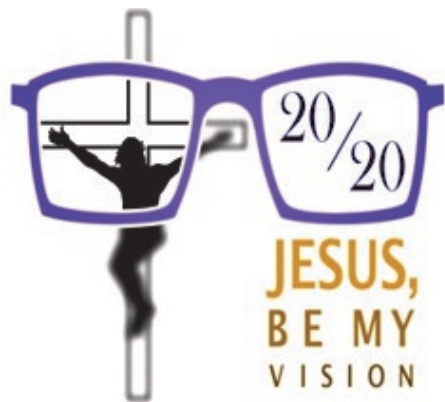

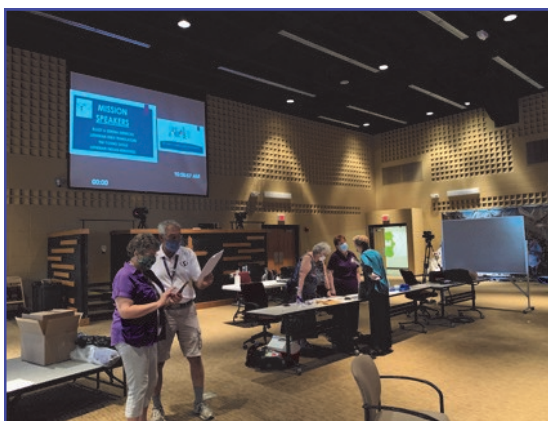

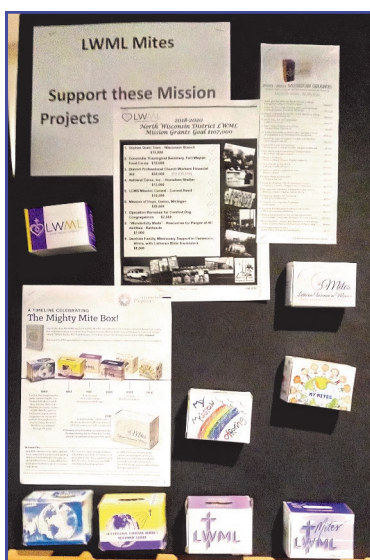
