

Short Term Mission: Change of Plans ... Again!

"For I know the plans I have for you," declares the LORD, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future" 1 Jeremiah 29:11.

It is with regret that we have to inform you that next summer's short-term mission trip to Orphan Grain Train and Mission Central is cancelled. Your short-term mission coordinators have not made this decision lightly. We polled those women who had initially expressed an interest in taking this trip. The results indicated a lack of interest in the trip at this time. Many women plan to attend the convention in Lexington and do not want to do a second trip. Others are not ready to be part of large groups and did not want to take the bus. Out of respect for the organizations we were planning to visit, we made the difficult decision to cancel at this time. We hope to take this trip at a future date when the pandemic is under control and a vaccine is widely available.

In lieu of a trip this summer, we encourage individuals, societies, congregations, and church groups to consider participating in "mission" through one or more of the following:

- ⊕ Look around your community to see what is needed. Many people are isolated and hurting. Is there someone who you can intentionally connect with via phone, email or letter? Can you collect items or volunteer at a food pantry? Can you collect items for the homeless shelter?
- Go to Mission Central: https://missioncentral.us Click on the Calendar tab at the top of the page. A number of missionaries have given a video report about their ministries in the countries they serve. Access these virtual reports by clicking the links. Pray for missionaries. Write them a note of encouragement.
- ⊕ Go to Orphan Grain Train: www.ogt.org Click the first tab What We Do and scroll down to Special Projects. You will find a number of projects from school kits to medical kits. Collect these items and assemble the kits.
- ⊕ Go to the National LWML website: lwml.org Press on the <u>Service</u> tab and scroll down for Mission service activity suggestions.
- ⊕ Use Thrivent Action Teams to organize a fund raiser for a non-profit organization like MOST Ministries. Many non-profits are struggling financially during this pandemic. Have a spring plant sale. Hold a bake sale. Do a silent auction and donate the profits.

We would love to encourage one another with stories and pictures of how you've used this COVID-Time to be a blessing to others. Send us your stories and pictures and we will write the article.

Blessings from your short-term mission coordinators as you navigate these times. Hold tight to Jesus and he will lead the way.

'm greatly amazed by the faithfulness of our LWML sisters and friends who continued to contribute their mites during the difficult year of 2020. Although many societies have not been able to meet for Bible study, fund raising activities, annual Advent activities and other service to their churches and communities. I hope we have been able to reach out to others through phone calls, texts, and emails as we all "get through this together."

Through the end of November 2020, NWD LWML is \$7500 behind in year-to-date mite collections compared to November 2019. Due to generous giving by many members and friends, we received \$3000 on "Giving Tuesday." We are still accepting contributions to the 2021 Convention Delegate Fund as well as donations to the 2023 Milwaukee National LWML convention, that we will be cosponsoring with several other districts.




Stamps for Missions




Give God thanks and always smile! Bless someone's life today by just giving them that smile with loving, crinkling eyes and say a prayer that they know the love of our great and awesome God.


