The population in Gorom, South Sudan usually cultivates their own food but not this year. Due to insecurities and floods, they have not been able to plant crops and the UN is predicting an increase in hunger. Many times the children have meals, but there is not enough food for the mothers and fathers who are also hungry.

In another South Sudan city, Pochalla, a paralytic gentleman since birth has never been able to get off the floor—until now.

William Okweri calls it a miracle. Not only did the shipment from Orphan Grain Train contain food to help feed hungry families, but it also contained a wheelchair that allowed this man to get off the floor for the first time since birth.



These hardships are not unique to South Sudan, but occur all over the world including here in the United States. While Orphan Grain Train collects food, clothing, quilts, medical supplies and equipment, mercy kits, Bibles, and other necessities to aid people in need around the world, they continue to face obstacles in getting them to those in need as shipping costs for the containers have escalated. Depending on the destination, total cost can range from \$8,000 - \$20,000. These costs are the major expense of the Wisconsin Branch of Orphan Grain Train as their operations are carried out by hundreds of volunteers throughout the state.



These grant monies will enable Orphan Grain Train–Wisconsin Branch, as God’s people, to not only share resources but bring Christ’s name and character to those in need, both near and far.
