Anne had no desire to attend "church" camp and cried all the way there. When her mom picked her up at the end of the week, Anne cried all the way home. Anne did not miss summer camp in subsequent years and served Camp Luther in many positions from Junior Counselor to First Assistant Program Director. She met her husband at Camp Luther and beginning in 2003, they attended Family Camp with their children.
