Almost 300,000 Wisconsin residents are part of the state's immigrant population. International students come to attend our colleges and universities and LCMS pastors and laypeople are working hard to reach out to them. These international students want to know more about the Christian faith. There is a big barrier though: the students don't speak or read English very well, and the evangelism teams don't speak the immigrants

language. This is where the Lutheran Heritage Foundation (LHF) can help.

To date, LHF has published over 100 different language versions of *Luther's Small Catechism*. *A Child's Garden of Bible Stories* is also available in 39 languages, with more translations underway. Books like *Luther's Small Catechism* and devotions or tracts translated into the languages of the people, provide an easy and logical outlook for the gospel. These resources enable Christians reaching out to those from these countries to leave the gospel message wherever they go, touching the hearts of those who weren't previously exposed to the word. These are free resources that the people of North Wisconsin can share with immigrant acquaintances as they become our friends and neighbors.



Each year, LHF's home office in Michigan receives hundreds of requests from LCMS district offices, churches, pastors and laypeople for the Lutheran books LHF has published in more than 120 languages. LHF can supply the books pastors and church people need to tell their new neighbors about their Savior, Jesus Christ, in their own language. However, as demand increases, LHF needs help with the costs of printing the materials

so the Word of Christ can be available to anyone, in any language.
