Rhubarb Meringue Torte

Coral Paul
715-652-3939

Mix together in bowl:

About 5 cups cut-up rhubarb
About 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ cup sugar
2 egg yolks well beaten
7-8 T. flour

Let sit while you mix crust.

Then put this rhubarb on top of crust

Mix together and put in 9 x 13 inch pan:
bottom layer (crust)

2 cups flour

1 $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp baking powder

2 $\frac{1}{2}$ T. sugar

2 egg yolks well beaten

$\frac{1}{2}$ cup plus 3 T. butter, melted

$\frac{3}{4}$ cup chopped nuts

(may add $\frac{1}{4}$ cup— $\frac{1}{2}$ & $\frac{1}{2}$ cream if too crumbly). Press in pan—(lightly)

Bake at 350 degrees for almost an hour.

Meringue

4 egg whites-beat stiff

add $\frac{3}{4}$ cup sugar gradually

Add 1 tsp vanilla.

Put this on top of baked crust the last 20 minutes of baking.

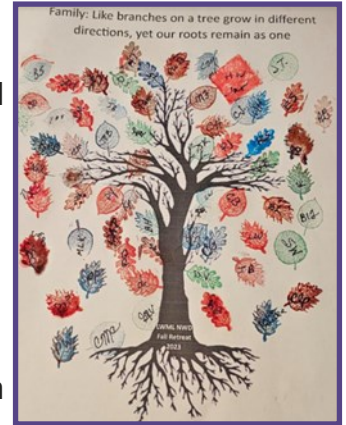

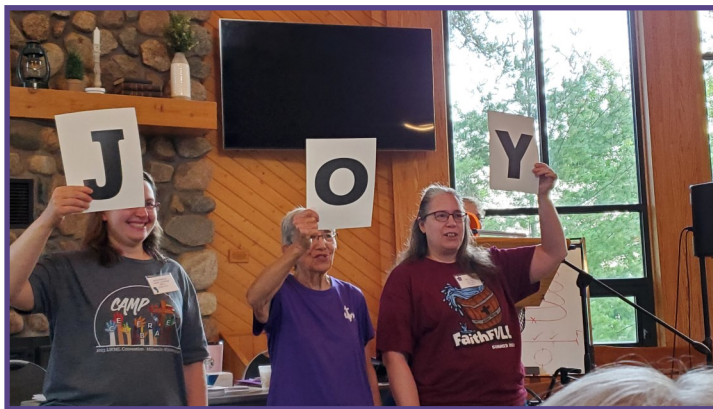
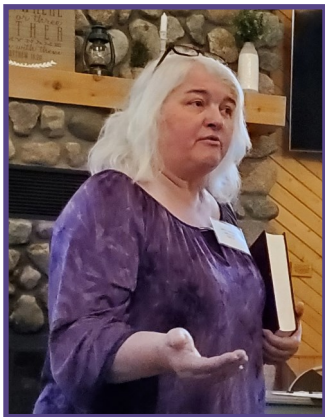
