

I recently read a wonderful devotion on the LWML website entitled SHINE! I liked it so much that I suggested we use it for our LWML Christmas get together at my home church, Faith Lutheran in Spooner.

The devotion was based on the familiar praise song, "This Little Gospel

Light of Mine." I think we all remember singing that song using our index finger to represent our light and singing, "I'm gonna let it shine, all the time, let it shine!"

Letting that light shine all the time is easier said than done. But really, we need to remember the light isn't really our light at all; but the light given to us, shone into our lives by God through His Son, Jesus Christ. "For God, who said, 'Let light shine out of darkness,' made His light shine in our hearts to give us the light of the knowledge of God's glory displayed in the face of Christ" (2 Corinthians 4:6).

Well, we have the light, now what are we going to do with it? We can't all be missionaries in far away lands, but we can tell our neighbor about Jesus, not just in words, but also in actions. Bring cookies to that neighbor who is too busy or unable to bake. Offer to take care of little ones so your neighbor can do some shopping. We can shine a light in our neighborhood by our acts of kindness. There is a verse in "This Little Gospel Light of Mine" that says, "All around the neighborhood, I'm gonna let it shine." Let's all do that.

There are many ways to shine our light in our local congregations. We can teach Sunday school, we can do Altar Guild duties, we can provide treats for coffee time, we can make coffee, we can greet those coming to worship, and we can hand out bulletins. As we actively participate in our congregations, we are not hiding our light.

There is a verse in "This Little Gospel Light of Mine" that says, "Hide it under a bushel, no! I'm gonna let it shine." This calls to mind the following: "You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden. Nor do people light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a stand, and it gives light to all in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven" (Matthew 5:14-16).



Then there is that verse that says, "Don't let Satan blow it out!" Being in God's Word daily is a good way to prevent that from happening. God has given us the Holy Spirit to empower us to live out our faith in whatever situation we may find ourselves. Pray to God for His

help through the Holy Spirit to be bold lights wherever you are.

Get Fit in 2024

God, create a clean heart for me, and renew a steadfast spirit within me (Ps. 51:10 CSV).

As we begin a new year here in 2024, many people are making resolutions to make some changes to their lives. Resolutions may be to be more active, to drink less or give up smoking, maybe to spend more time with family or to

complain less. People make such resolutions to try and improve their lives in some facet. Maybe you yourself have made a resolution to in some way improve your life for 2024. Or maybe you just don't make a resolution anymore and for good reason.

According to Forbes in 2023, "37% of Americans said they had a goal or resolution they wanted to achieve." And according to research done by Ohio State University (OSU) "suggest that only 9% of Americans that make resolutions complete them. In fact, research goes on to show that 23% of people quit their resolution by the end of the first week, and 43% quit by the end of January."

So, did you make a resolution in 2023? Were you a part of the 9% success rate, or more likely part of the 91% failure? If you were like me, chances are you were not as successful as you had hoped to be. Those who have been successful are usually those who have had accountability partners to help them along the way. To encourage them, remind them, and to struggle alongside them as they seek to make positive changes in their lives.

In Psalm 51, we hear that David desires to make positive changes in his life. He had his sins and struggles that he dealt with and like us, he resolved to do better to make a change. But King David's desire, his resolution was a little different. He desired a

clean heart and a steadfast (right) spirit. But David knew that he was unable to be successful on his own. If left to his own devices, to his own efforts, he would be part of the failure group. And those who try to do things on their own, those who are left to their own devices spiritually will fail not 91% of the time, but 100% of the time. Jesus reminds us from out of the heart comes all sorts of evil (Matthew 15:19 CSV) and the intention of man's heart is evil from his youth (Genesis 8:21).

So, in order to get fit, in order to be spiritually healthy, David cries to the Lord "Create in me a clean heart." David looks outside himself for success, he looks to the creator of the heart, he looks to God. And the Lord heard David's cry and forgave him (Psalm 32) – restoring to him the joy of salvation. Or as St. Paul says, Blessed are those whose lawless acts are forgiven and whose sins are covered. Blessed is the person the Lord will never charge with sin (Romans 4:6-8 CSV). David looked to the Lord to get fit to be healthy spiritually.



As we begin 2024 maybe one of our resolutions could be like King David, to be more spiritually fit. But this can't be done on our own: no. like David we need the

Lord. We aren't left to do this on our own, instead we have more than an accountability partner, we have a Lord and Savior. We have one who not only encourages us but has walked the path we could not. One who kept His heart clean from all deceitfulness and has kept all resolutions, all the Word of God perfectly. And who now leads us and reminds us of all that He has done for us by His life, His death on the cross, and His resurrection.

And He comes to you in His Word to encourage you, to forgive you, to restore you and to cleanse. You resolved through the waters of baptism to cleanse your hearts and


President's Message



Kaye Dumas Wolff has been active in the LWML most of her life, and has served in local, district and national roles within the organization. During her term as LWML Vice President of Special Focus Ministries (2015-19), Kaye started the Deaf Ministry Outreach Program to encourage hearing women to learn basic American Sign Language (ASL) and Deaf culture, and to encourage and welcome deaf women into active participation in LWML groups. Kaye was the Bible Study Leader at the 2023 LWML Convention in Milwaukee where she completed her term as chairman of the 2021-23 Nominating Committee.

Kaye has authored articles for the Lutheran Woman's Quarterly and Bible studies for Lutheran Women in Mission groups, and has written Lenten devotions for Lutheran Hour Ministries, where she was a Mission U witnessing facilitator for 14 years.

Kaye was the recipient of the 2023 "Christus Vivit" Award from Concordia Seminary, St. Louis for her exemplary work in The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod. Over the years, Kaye has been involved with outreach in Black and Multicultural ministry, presented several LCMS Rural and Small-Town Mission webinars, and was instrumental in making the LCMS docu-movie "The First Rosa," about the pioneer Lutheran educator and missionary Rosa Young. She has also been a guest on KFUO's radio show "The Coffee Hour," and "The Lutheran Ladies Lounge."

Kaye and her husband, Rev. Paul A. Wolff, live in Southfield, Michigan. They worship at Emmanuel Lutheran Church in Dearborn where Rev. Wolff serves as the assistant pastor. Kaye Wolff is learning ASL and enjoys cooking and eating, dressing in cultural attire, traveling and music.

Rev. Kevin D. Robson has served as Chief Mission Officer of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod since 2015. Rev. Robson is responsible to the Synod President for all LCMS mission, ministry, programmatic and coordinative functions, including the fulfillment of LCMS Board for International Mission and Board for National Mission policies. He directly supervises the Synod's Offices of International Mission, National Mission and Pastoral Education, as well as its Mission Advancement and Communications units, ensuring appropriate planning and coordination across all these ministries. As CMO, he also serves on the Synod's

Operations and Administrative Teams, chairs the Synod's Pastoral Formation Committee, represents Synod and President on several LCMS-established or affiliated entity boards (including the LCMS Foundation and Concordia University System) and regularly interacts with various Synod agency and auxiliary heads and church partners in the furtherance of LCMS objectives.

Rev. Robson previously served as parish pastor to LCMS congregations in the Minnesota South and Minnesota North Districts. Prior to seminary, he worked in research, product management, business development, sales and strategic consulting assignments for two global corporate enterprises. His academic background includes an M.Div., Concordia Theological Seminary, Fort Wayne; M.B.A. University of Chicago Booth School of Business, Chicago; and a B.S. Chemistry and B.S.E. Chemical Engineering, University of Michigan, Ann Arbor. Outside of his work for the LCMS, Rev. Robson is an avid bicyclist, a voracious reader and a devotee of classical and jazz music. He and his wife Peg have loved singing together in various choral groups over the 38+ years of their marriage.

August 5 – August 9, 2024

Things are coming together for our short-term mission trip to Michigan next summer. We have made plans to visit five of the Recognized Service Organizations (RSO) of LCMS. You will find out valuable information about these organizations and see how they function as the Body of Christ. LWML has been a valuable partner with them through prayer, mission grants, ingatherings and materials production. God blesses and uses us all for the blessing of others and for the spread of the Gospel.
